






one's intrinsic abilities. In the end, Sir suggested students not to waste food and not to carry ego.

Madam specially focussed on the effect of pandemic on the food supply which caused food shortages, concern of food safety and food hygiene and health issues.

Madam also discussed about the deficiencies of diet which causes malnutrition (under nutrition) and over nutrition apart from causing low immunity.
